ASPR TRACIE: A Virtual Force Multiplier Supporting Health Care Workers in the Field.

ASPR TRACIE was created to meet the information and technical assistance (TA) needs of regional ASPR staff, health care coalitions, health care entities, health care providers, emergency managers, public health practitioners, and others working in disaster medicine, health care system preparedness, and public health emergency preparedness. Each domain (TR, AC, and IE) provides users with unique support:

Technical Resources includes a Resource Library that contains audience-tailored materials; Topic Collections reviewed by our cadre of subject matter experts (SMEs); and materials highlighting real-life tools and experiences.

The **Assistance Center** provides personalized support for requests for information and TA and is accessible by toll-free number, email, or web form.



The **Information Exchange** is an area for password-protected discussion and materials exchange between vetted users in near real-time.

ASPR TRACIE Stands Ready to Support Our Stakeholders and Provide the Right Resources at the Right Time. In just seven years, we have welcomed over 1.6 million visitors to our website, developed more than 450 new resources with our SMEs (on topics such as

COVID-19, mass violence, health care coalitions, disaster behavioral health, and rural communities), and responded to nearly 11,200 requests for TA (3,000 related to COVID-19). We have developed tools for health care providers to estimate supplies needed in a surge, exercise templates for a variety of scenarios, and templates to help our stakeholders plan for the worst.
