An online search for related materials was also conducted. Resources gathered can be found in this document.

I. Active Shooter Drills

Arizona Department of Health Services. (2014). <u>Code Silver/Active Shooter Tabletop Exercise</u> for Community Health Centers: Situation Manual (SitMan).

This Situation Manual (SitMan) is intended for participants of a tabletop exercise that focuses on emergency response plans, policies, and procedures as they pertain to an active shooter event at a community health center.
