## **ASPR TRACIE Technical Assistance Request**

## **Request:**

The requestor asked ASPR TRACIE:

- 1. How to request assistance for small rural hospitals with completing FEMA paperwork during and after a disaster.
- 2. How to get funding/ cache reserves for rural hospitals that need to stay open during a disaster and operate outside of regular hospital requirements (even if there are damages to the hospital).

## **Response:**

1. The ASPR TRACIE Team does not provide direct assistance to healthcare facilities in completing grant or FEMA paperwork prior to, during, or after a disaster. We reached out to representatives from FEMA Region IV and ASPR's Recovery Division. The information included herein and attached were provided by those representatives. **Note**: For copies of those attachments, contact the <u>ASPR TRACIE Assistance Center</u>.

There is not a singular FEMA point of contact for Public Assistance requests. Those facilities looking to become an applicant will need to submit a Request for Public Assistance through their state emergency management department for consideration to receive funding through FEMA's Public Assistance program.

In coordination with the state, the applicant will be assigned a program delivery manager to assist them in filling out any FEMA paperwork.

FEMA categorizes certain private non-profits (PNP) as critical facilities within the medical arena. Certain documents are required for a facility to be considered eligible for assistance (e.g., a ruling letter from the U.S. Internal Revenue Service granting tax exemption). These PNP categories include:

- Emergency medical care (diagnosis or treatment of mental or physical injury or disease) provided in:
  - o Clinics
  - o Facilities that provide in-patient care for convalescent or patients with chronic disease
  - o Hospices and nursing homes
  - o Hospitals and related facilities, including:
    - Central service facilities operated in connection with hospitals
    - Extended-care facilities
    - Facilities related to programs for home-health services
    - Laboratories



- Self-care units
- Storage, administration, and record areas
- o Long-term care facilities
- Outpatient facilities
- o Rehabilitation centers that provide medical care

Once FEMA approves the applicant as eligible, the applicant will work with the state and FEMA to identify eligible costs for reimbursement as a result of the disaster through the Obligation of Project Worksheets.
