Request:

[REDACTED] asked if ASPR TRACIE had resources on healthcare coalition (HCC) staffing models. She noted her coalition receives funding from the state (awardee) through a fiduciary agent (their Hospital and Healthcare Association), and is not a formal business entity, such as 501(c)(3).

I. HCC Staffing Model Resources

Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene. (2014). [Framework for Development of Healthcare Preparedness Coalitions](#).

This state-specific document is intended to assist health departments and healthcare system partners to identify gaps in preparedness, determine specific priorities, and develop plans for building and sustaining healthcare specific capabilities. It does not provide specifics about coalition administration, but includes discussion of multiple examples from within Maryland, other states, and the District of Columbia. NOTE: Appendix A includes research on existing HCCs and several include general staff types.

This PowerPoint includes presentations from six different types of healthcare coalitions. The first three presenters briefly discuss their staffing models or note how many staff they have dedicated to coalition activities.

This concise governance document may be used by other coalitions as a model for developing their own governance documents. It outlines the structure and process used by Sonoma County Healthcare Coalition to develop cooperative disaster capacities. It includes sections on membership, meetings, steering committee, subcommittees, and funding and staffing. Sonoma County (CA) has a population of near 500,000.
