CMS-specific Information (updated):

In February 2019, CMS updated the State Operations Manual: Appendix Z-Emergency Preparedness for All Provider and Certified Supplier Types Interpretive Guidance, which addresses specific regulatory expectations. The updated document includes emerging infectious diseases to the definition of all-hazards approach; provides new Home Health Agency citations; and lists clarifications under alternate source power and emergency standby systems.
