Response to the Bryce Canyon Tour Bus Mass Casualty Incident

DeAnn is currently the Hospital Administrator at Garfield Memorial Hospital, an Intermountain Health facility, in Panguitch, Utah. She has served in this position since 2022.

DeAnn began her career with Intermountain Healthcare at Valley View Hospital (now Cedar City Hospital) and has been at Garfield since 1994. She became a certified nurse midwife in 1997 and still sees obstetrics patients. She earned her doctorate of nursing practice in 2017 from the University of Utah. She is active in the community, serving on the Panguitch Prevention Coalition. DeAnn is a member of the Intermountain Healthcare Ethics Committee and is a 2018 recipient of the Spirit of Intermountain Award.

On Friday, September 20, 2019, DeAnn was the current Nurse Administrator and served as Incident Commander for a multiple injury tour bus crash carrying 30 Chinese tourists.
