
### Background

- This activity was part of a "Healthy Homes" initiative and was developed in collaboration with the Department of Health's Asthma Program.
- The Health and Safety Bingo is an educational tool for organizations working with vulnerable populations.

- Three versions of the game were created: one for children, youths and adults, and older adults.
- This game was adapted to an online platform, so it can be played remotely.




## Links for Online Health and Safety Bingo

### How is the game facilitated? 1/3



- 1. There must be a person who facilitates the game (asks questions and provides discussion answers).
- 2. All participants can access the BINGO game online using the link for the specific game.
- 3. There is no limit to how many people can play or how many times the link can be used.



### How is the game facilitated? 2/3

- 3. Once the participants access the link and generate their board, the game facilitator will explain the instructions produced by the system. Instructions appear in English, but the translation is included in the Facilitator's Guide.
- 4. The facilitator explains that each drawing is connected to a health and safety prevention theme, which will be discussed during the game.



### How is the game facilitated? 3/3


- 5. The facilitator reads the questions in any order until one of the participants covers an entire line on their BINGO board.
- 6. Being a short game, you can't ask all the questions in a single round, as all the boards have the same images. We recommend that you limit questions per round to a maximum of:

10 questions in the Bingos for children and older adults

15 questions in the Bingo youth and adults.

According to our tests, some player should say BINGO within that number of questions, but in case of not happening ask the players to generate a new card.






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### **Q&A Guide**


### How is this educational bingo played?



- 1. After accessing the link, participants will see the name of the game and a button to generate their bingo card.
- 2. Once the facilitator asks a question, the players only need to press the image with the pointer to select their answer.
- 3. The first participant to cover an entire line on his/her board, whether vertical, horizontal or diagonal, must say "BINGO" to announce that she/he won the game.



### To get a new bingo card



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- 1. Press the three bars in the lower right corner of the screen to access the options menu and select "new".
- 2. Re-enter the link and generate a new BINGO card.

### **Data collection**



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- This activity provides a good opportunity to conduct an impact survey.
- At the end of the game, facilitators can collect information on the number of participants, age group, municipality, opinion of the participants, or any other indicator relevant to the institution.
- These types of surveys can be created with Microsoft Forms or using free platforms available on the internet.
